Re: Samish Bay Sports Club, Inc. Dear Neighbor:

I am writing this letter on behalf of Samish Bay Sports Club, Inc. which is the new name of the long established hunting club which is located immediately to the south of the southeast shore of Samish Island.

During the last several months, the club has been reorganized and now consists of 12 owner-members.

Since the annual waterfowl season commences in mid-October each year and continues until approximately the 1st week of January thereafter, we will be conducting hunting activities, as usual, during that period of time each year.

All of us have been members of the club for the last many years and during that time we have never become aware of any complaints concerning our activities. However, in an effort to continue to be good neighbors, we wish to advise the occupants of Samish Island and, in particular, those whose homes are located on the southeast shore, facing our club property, that the members of the club have unanimously agreed that we will abandon the blind, or blinds, which have been located on the northern most portion of our property, nearest Samish Island, and will no longer use that northern most portion of our property for hunting purposes.

Additionally, we wish to assure our neighbors that it is not our intent to ever develop our property in any manner whatsoever for use other than as a home for wildlife. Our hope is that this property will remain in its present natural state in perpetuity.

Further, we wish to suggest that if any occupant of Samish Island and, in particular those whose homes are located on the southeast shore thereof, have any complaints concerning the hunting practices followed by our members or guests, that they contact the undersigned at (206) 622-2200 or (206) 232-3118.
